Give Later (gifts that cost you nothing in your lifetime)

I. Gift in your Will or Trust

2. Retirement Asset Beneficiary Designation

- No lawyer needed simply complete the beneficiary designation form with your plan administrator

- Can reduce estate taxes, if applicable, and can minimize income tax to heirs

3. Life Insurance Beneficiary Designation

- No lawyer needed simply complete the beneficiary designation form with your agent
- ° Proceeds can be divided as you wish
- •Can reduce estate taxes, if applicable, and can minimize income tax to heirs

4. Donor Advised Fund

- Name Camp Nakanawa as a beneficiary on your fund
- Use your DAF to make annual and major gifts to Camp Nakanawa

5. IRA - Qualified Charitable Distribution

- (from your Required Minimum Distribution, aka Charitable IRA Rollover) • Decreases taxable income if over 70 ½
- Satisfies RMD requirements
- Work directly with plan administrator to initiate gift

6. Appreciated Stock

Tax-wise planning could reduce or avoid capital gains
 Give from assets not cash flow

- 7. Charitable Remainder Trust
 - Tax-wise planning minimizes tax liability including capital gains and estate tax
 - Receive income for up to 20 years or life
 - ° Camp Nakanawa receives the remainder

CONTINGENT GIFT

REMAINDER (OR RESIDUAL) GIFT

"I give to the Camp Nakanawa Endowment Fund at the Community Foundation of Greater Chattanooga, a Tennessee nonprofit located in Chattanooga, Tennessee (EIN 62-6045999), or its successor organization, (all or _____% of) the residue or remainder of the property owned by me at death, real and personal and wherever situated, for support of its academic mission."

<u>Restricted Gift:</u> "This gift is to be used for the purposes(s) set forth in a separate written agreement(s) between me and Camp Nakanawa, as may be amended from time to time. If there is no such agreement, the gift is unrestricted."





Beneficiary Designation

Restricting Your Gift
