
#### Whale of a Tale

While taking a short story class a few years ago, Patsy's instructor encouraged her to expand on a manuscript she had written.


"Camp played a part in this process," she said. "I learned how to keep trying and not give up; to dig deep and find the tenacity to try for something that was really beyond my reach."
