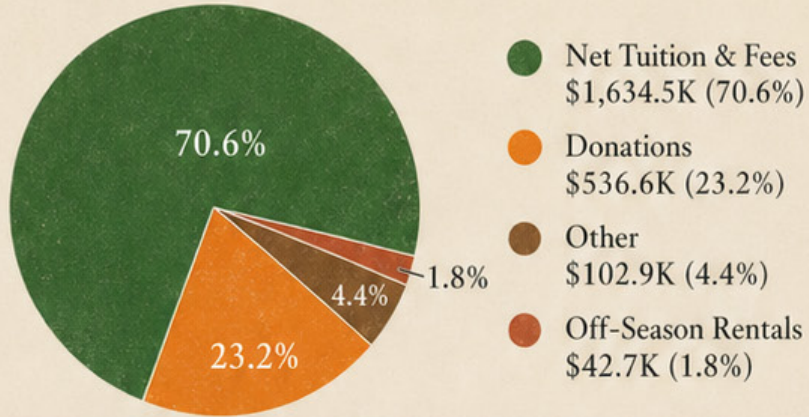

REVENUE MIX FY25



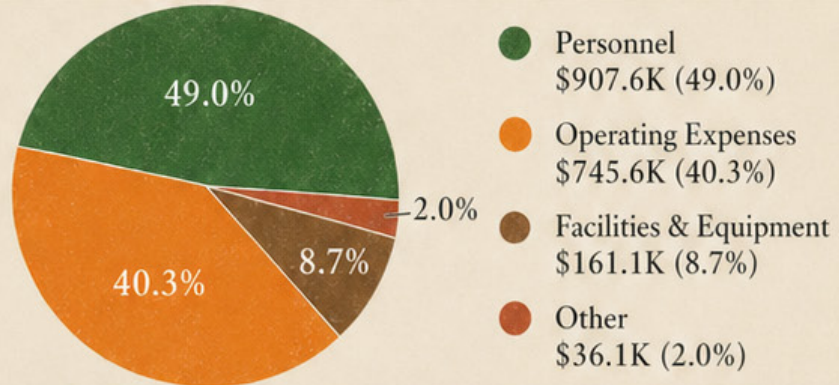
Total Revenue FY25:

EXPENSE MIX FY25



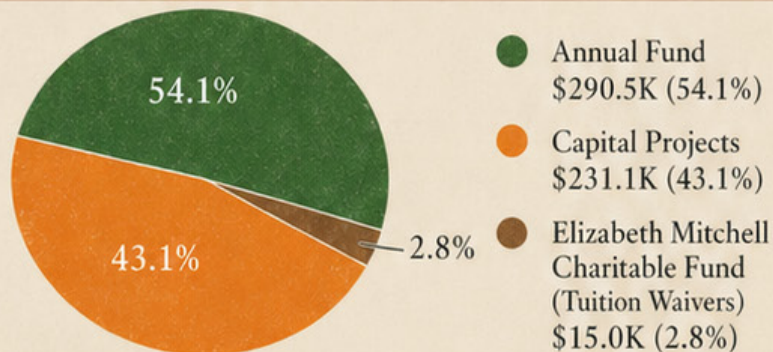
Total Expenses FY25:
